

Uninstalling RPNow from PC Machine

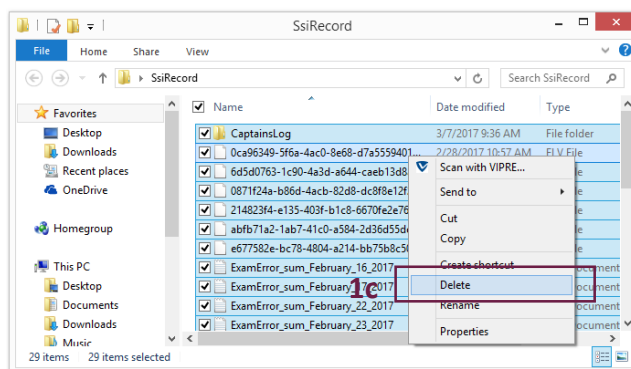
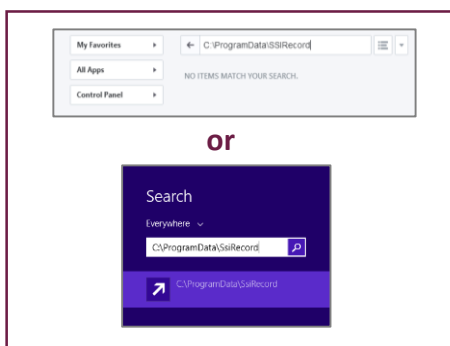

1. Remove the SSiRecord folder contents

This folder will only be visible via search. You cannot navigate there directly.

- Open the search either from the task bar, by swiping right from the edge of the screen, or clicking in the top right corner of the screen. Type “C:\ProgramData\SSiRecord”
- Open the folder and click on any item. Press Ctrl + A to select all.
- Right click and select “Delete.”

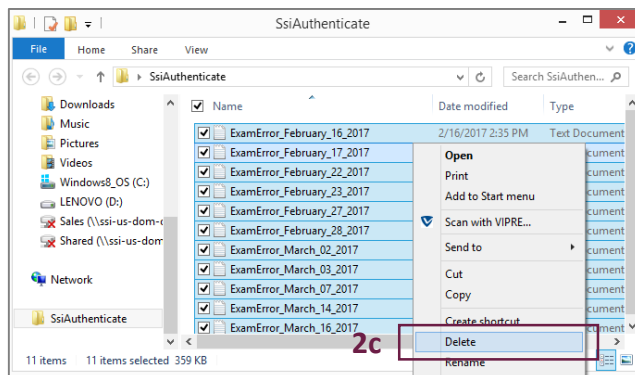
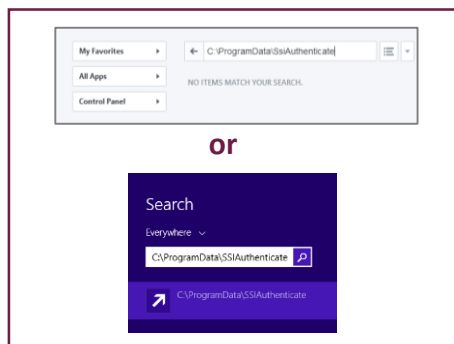


2. Remove the SSiAuthenticate folder contents

This folder will only be visible via search. You cannot navigate there directly.

- Open the search either from the task bar, by swiping right from the edge of the screen, or clicking in the top right corner of the screen. Type “C:\ProgramData\SSiAuthenticate”
- Open the folder and click on any item. Press Ctrl + A to select all.
- Right click and select “Delete.”

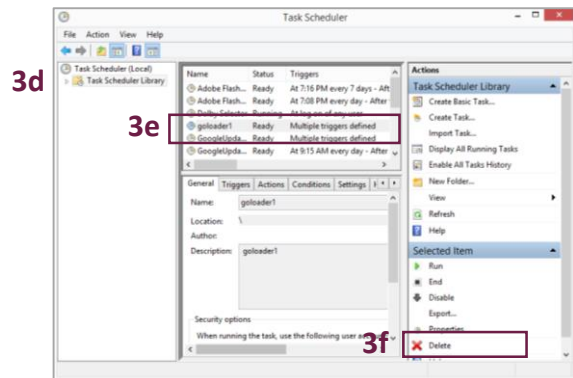
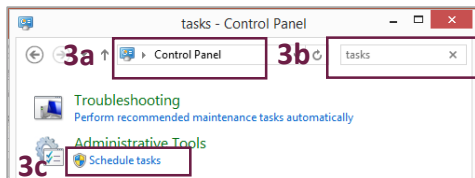

3. Remove the Goloader task

- Open the "Control Panel"
- Search for "tasks" or go to Control Panel > Administrative Tools > Schedule tasks.
- Select "Schedule tasks."
- Select the "Task Scheduler Library."
- Find and select "goloader1" in the main window.
- Click "Delete" under "Actions."



4. Remove the Remote Proctor Now icon

- Find "Remote Proctor Now" on your desktop. The icon should look like the below.
- Right click and delete the icon.

5. Remove the 2.0 Folder

This folder will only be visible via search. You cannot navigate there directly.

- Press Ctrl + Alt + Delete to access the “Task Manager.”
- Navigate to the user tab. Your username is listed there. Note the username listed.
In the image, the username is “cwall.”
- Open the search either from the task bar, by swiping right from the edge of the screen, or clicking in the top right corner of the screen. Type “C:\Users\\AppData\Local\Apps”
In the string, <username> should be replaced by the username you found in step 5b. In this example, it is “cwall” so the search was “C:\Users\cwall\AppData\Local\Apps.”
- Select folder “2.0” and right click to delete.
